





The United Kingdom, Italy, and Spain hosted



### **DURATION OF U.S. STUDY ABROAD**

## NON-CREDIT EDUCATION ABROAD

Over 38,100 U.S. students participated in non-credit work, internships, volunteering, and research abroad, in addition to the 347,099 students who received academic credit for study abroad in 2018/19.
