





Who is Counted?




U.S. citizens & permanent residents receiving credit from their home institution for study abroad

January and spring programs shortened or cancelled due to travel restrictions and lockdowns


Summer programs largely cancelled due to continued restrictions








Study abroad at HBCUs by duration, 2018/19








Study abroad at HBCUs by duration











Study abroad at HBCUs by gender, 2019/20






Study abroad at HBCUs by race and ethnicity, 2019/20


