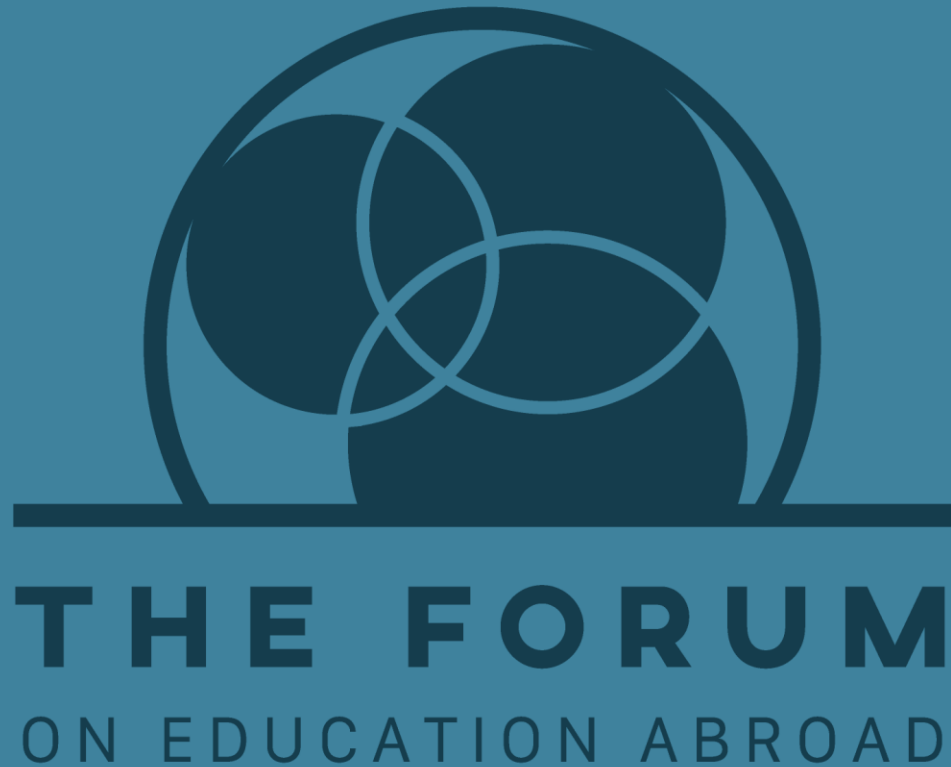

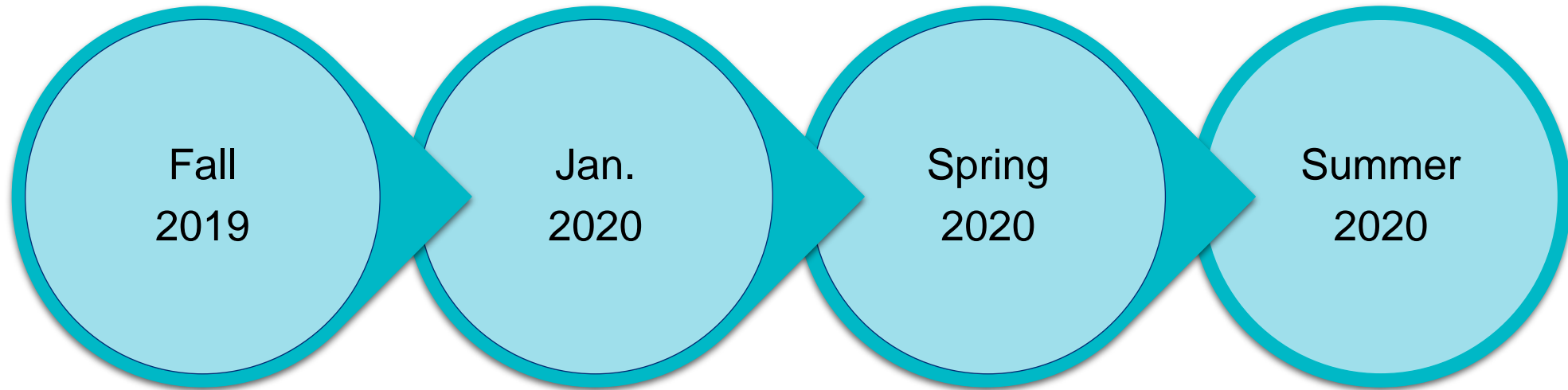

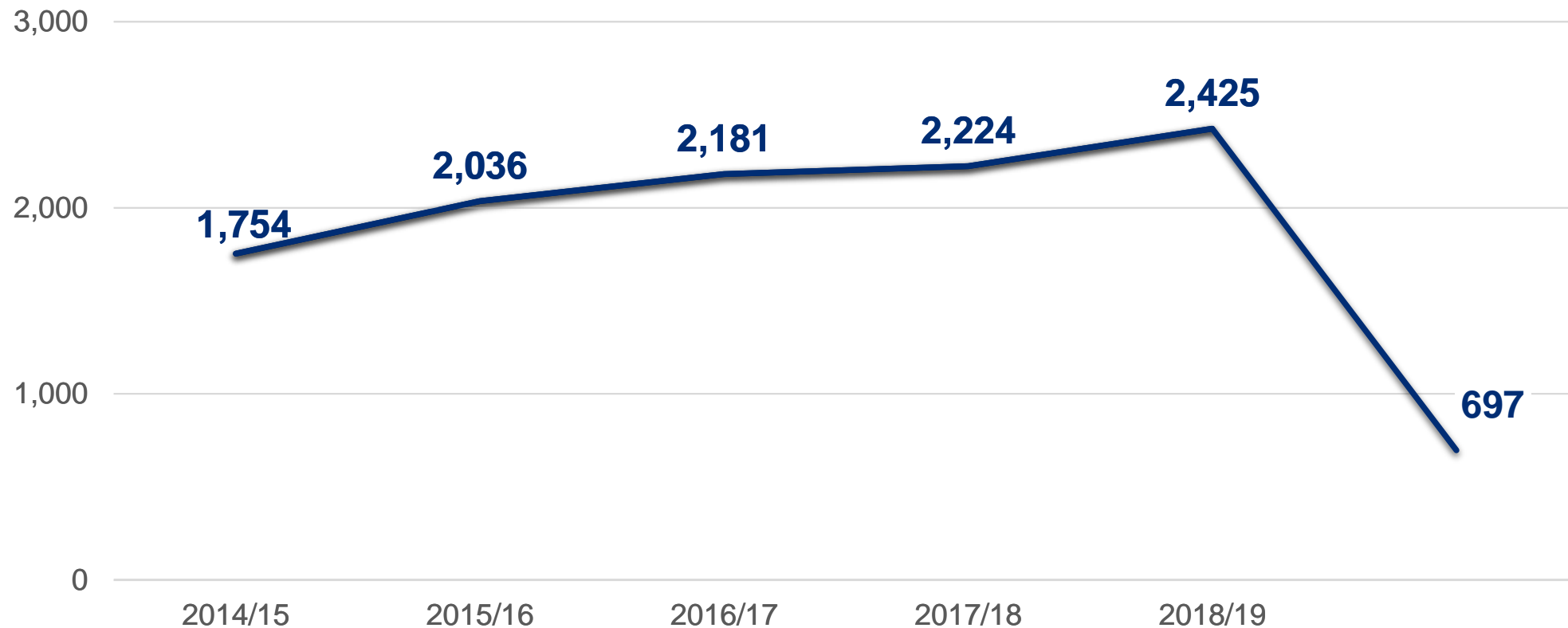


Most fall 2019 study

as in previous years

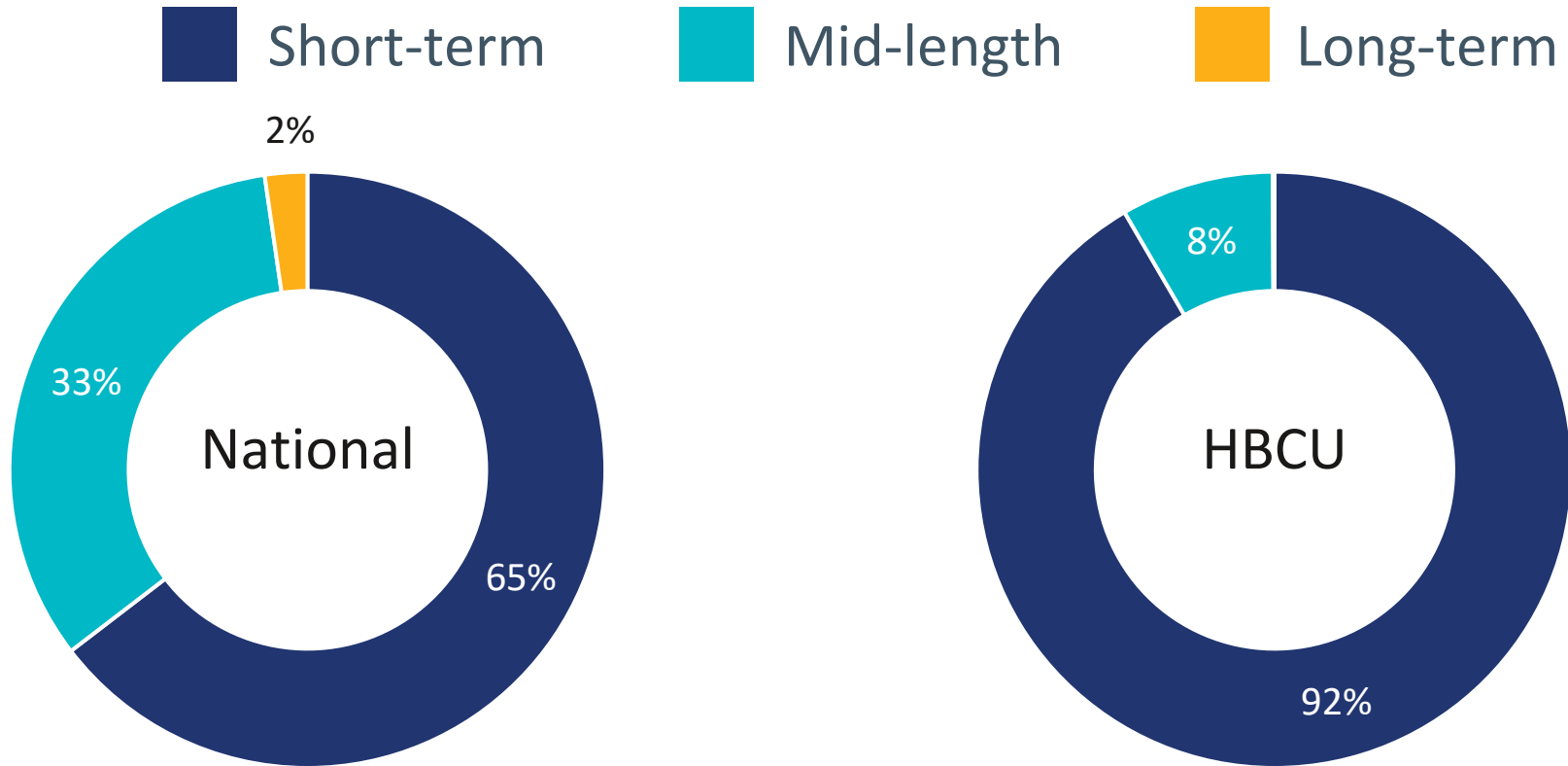
January and spring

continued restrictions

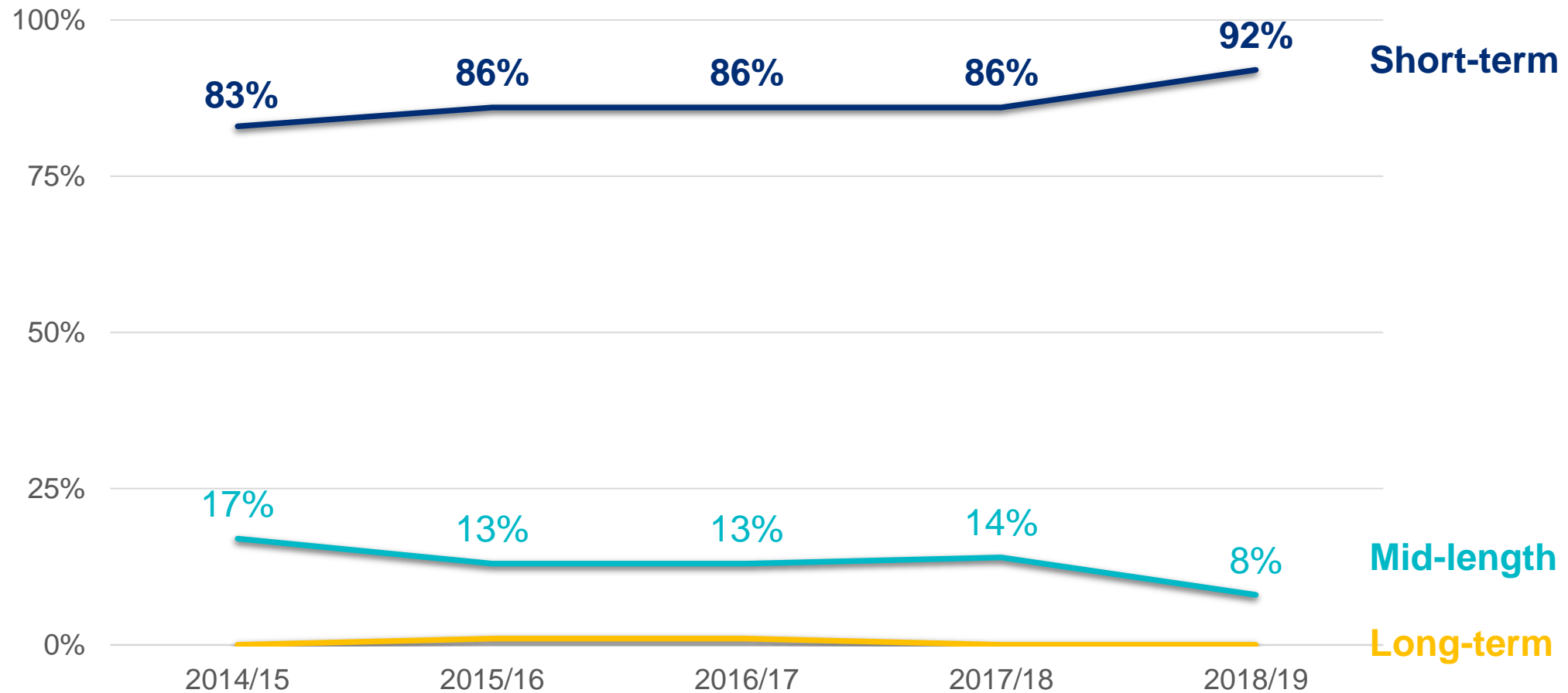

# Study abroad at HBCUs by duration, 2018/19

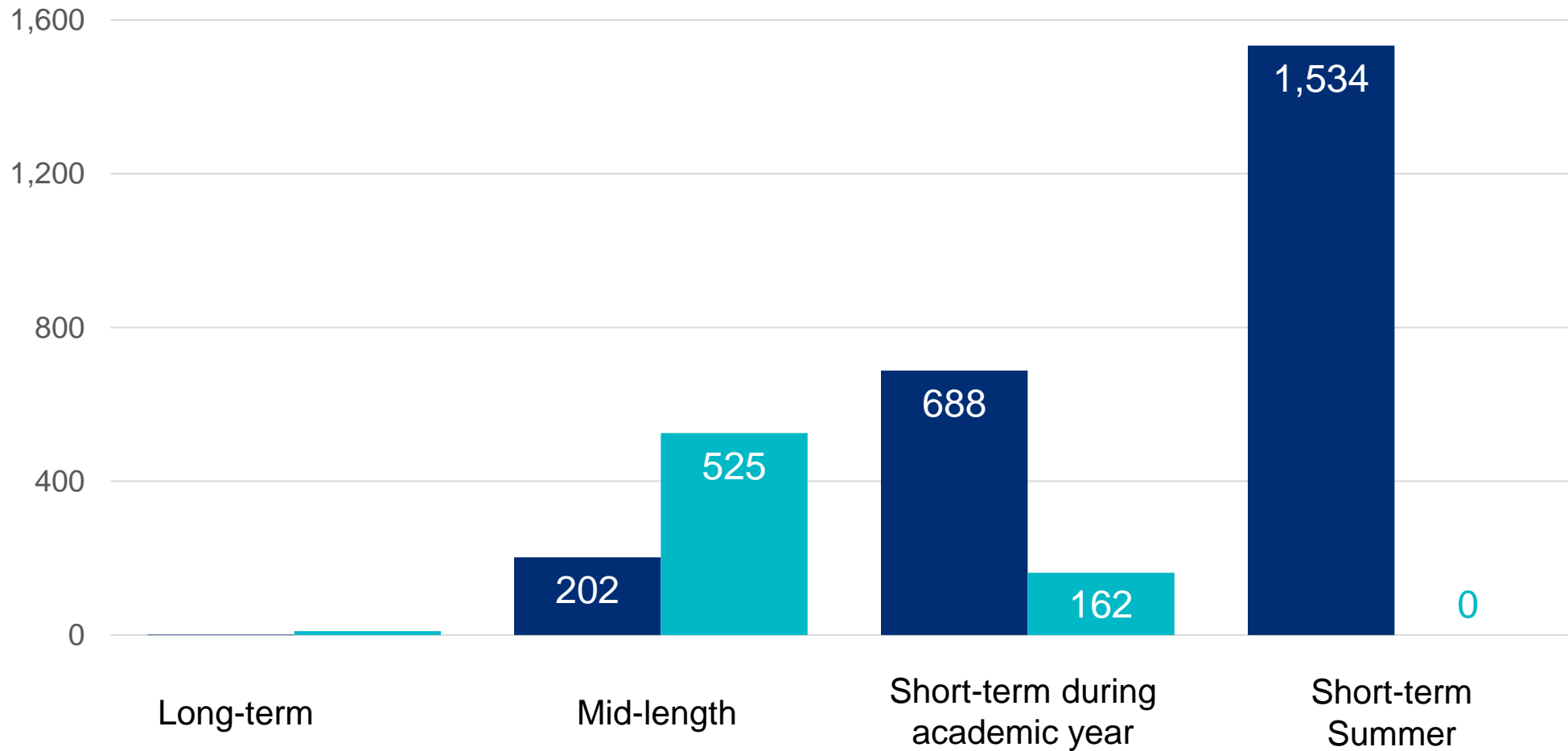

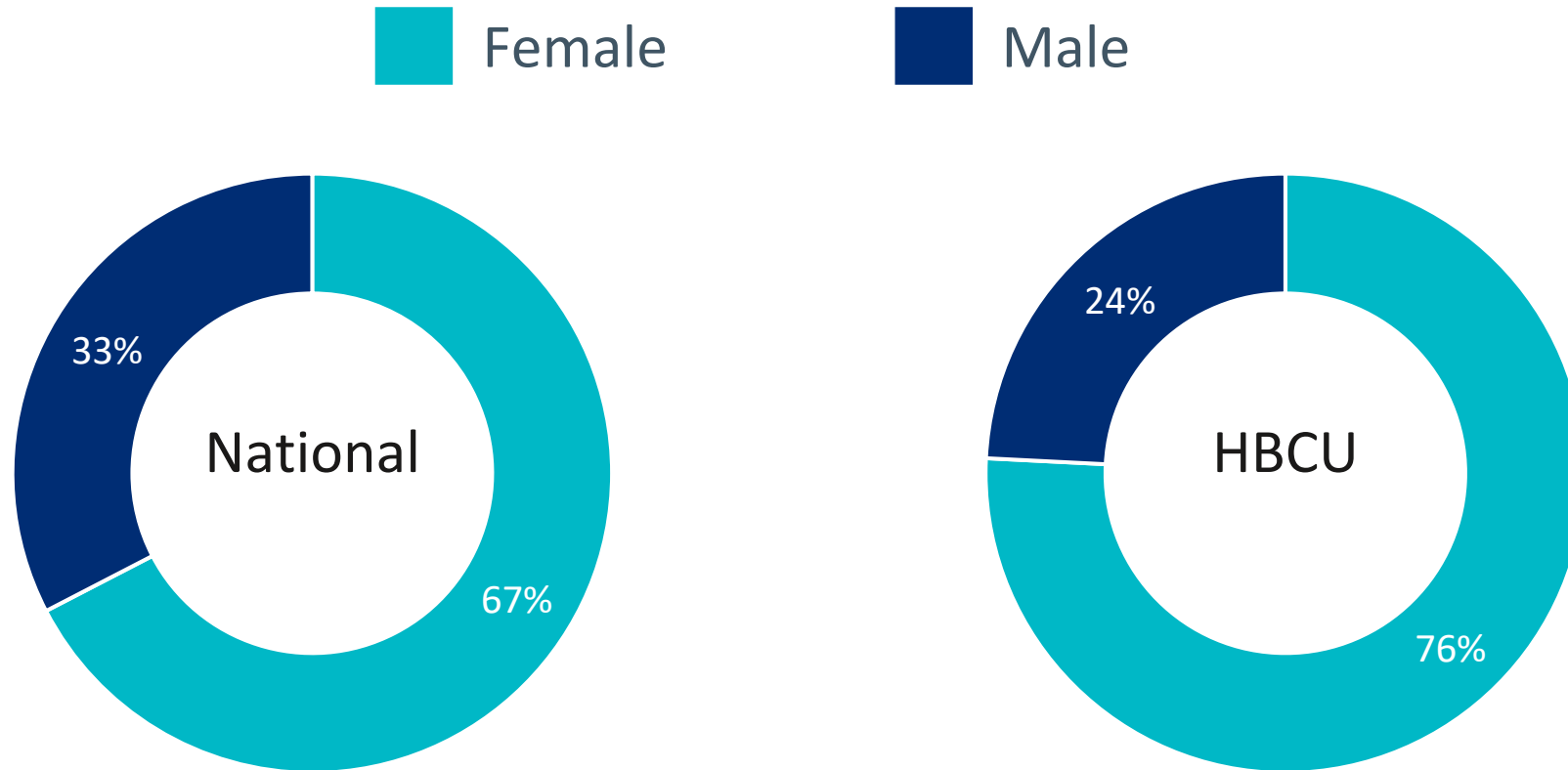

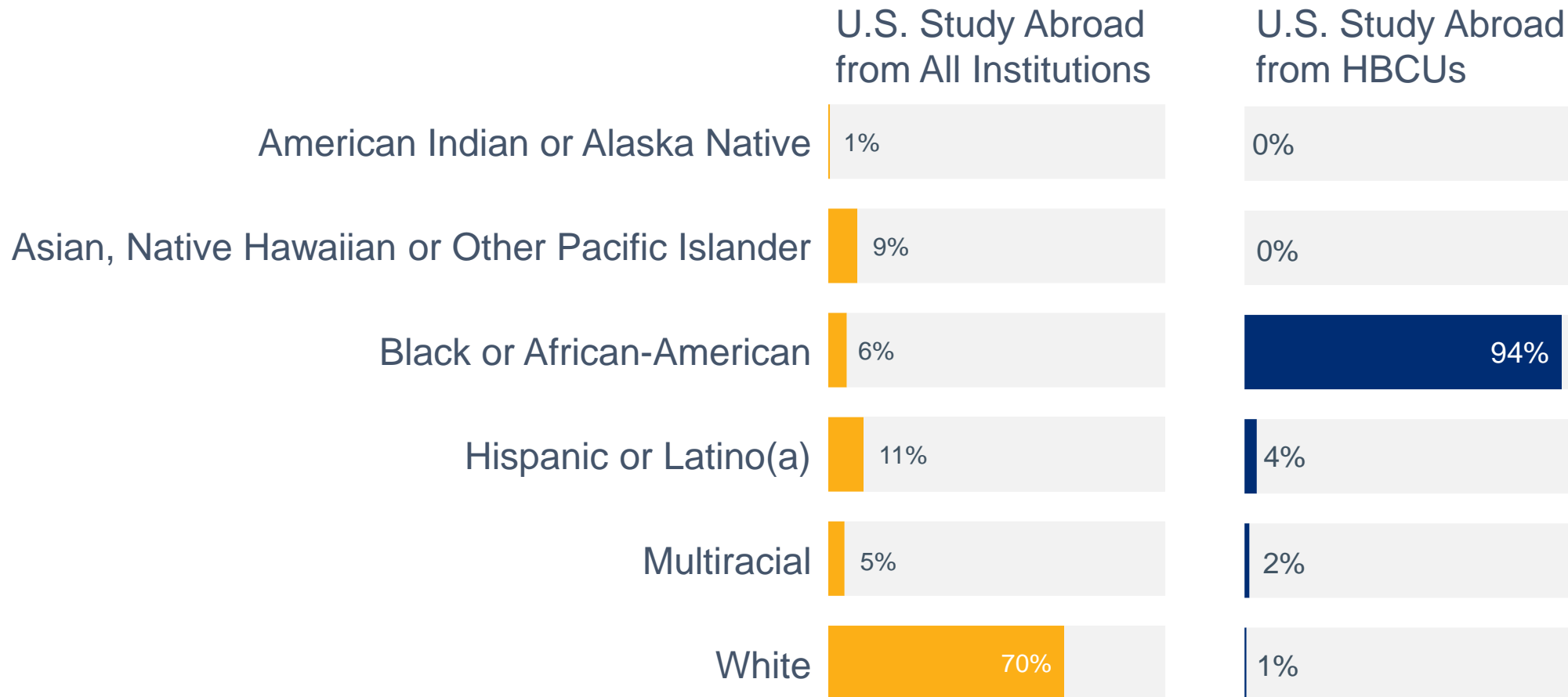


# Study abroad at HBCUs by gender, 2019/20

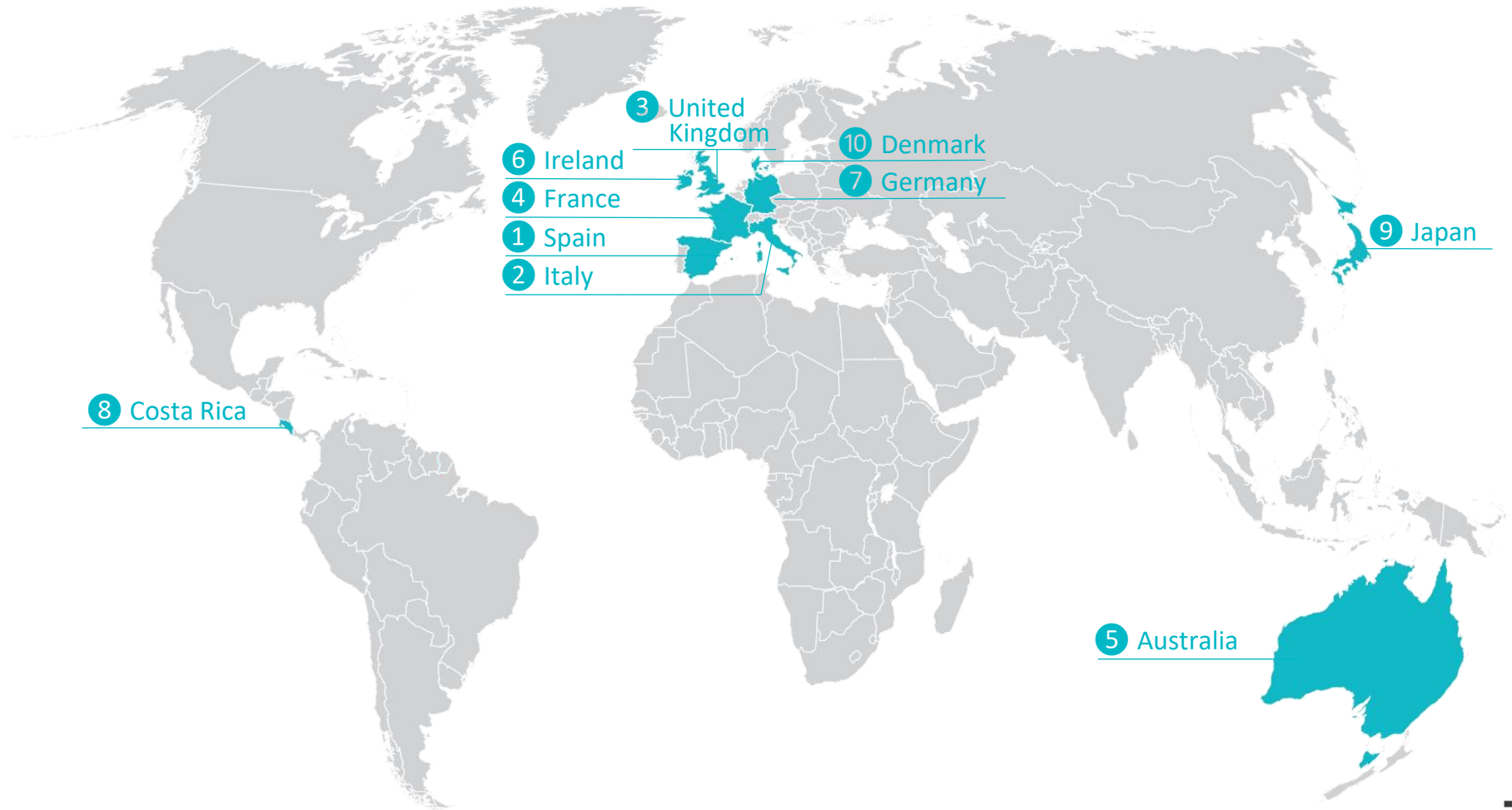




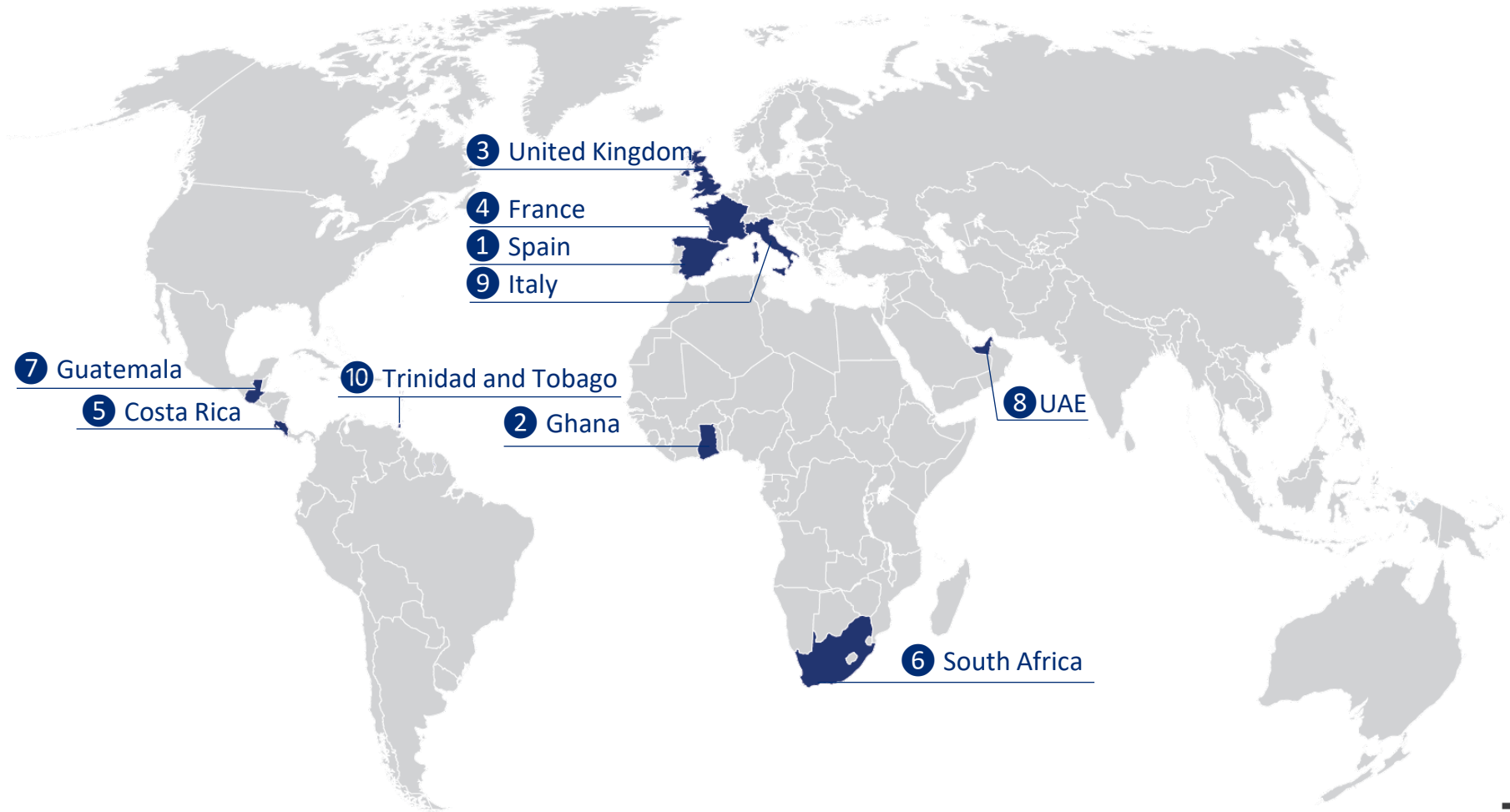
# Study abroad at HBCUs by race and ethnicity, 2019/20



# National study abroad by leading destinations, 2019/20



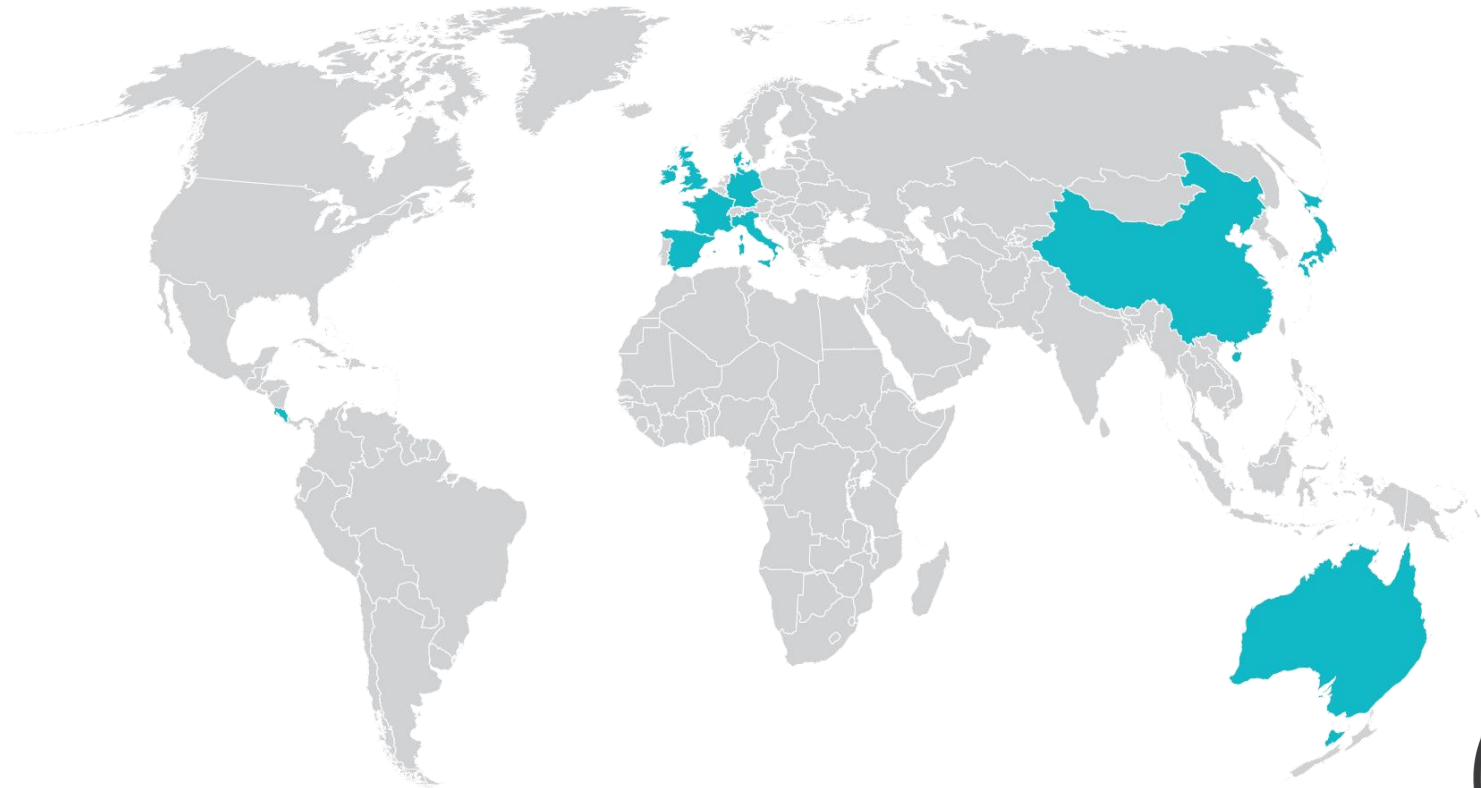
