









#### International IEP student week enrollment



# IEP Enrollments by State




















# IEPs: Number of Institutions by Program Type













## Percent of IEP students intending to pursue further non-IEP study at U.S. institutions






### 5 Key Takeaways:

- The number of IEP students rebounded by **63%** to reach near prepandemic levels, with 64,106 international IEP students in 2022.
- **92%** of IEPs have returned to in-person instruction.
- **31%** of international IEP students were from Japan, France, and China.
- International IEP students study at U.S. programs for 10 weeks on average.
- The profile of students attending programs at institutions affiliated with higher education institutions varies from independent providers not affiliated with colleges and universities.



#### IEP Enrollment as a Percent of All International Students




# **Enrollment Trends by Percent Change**


