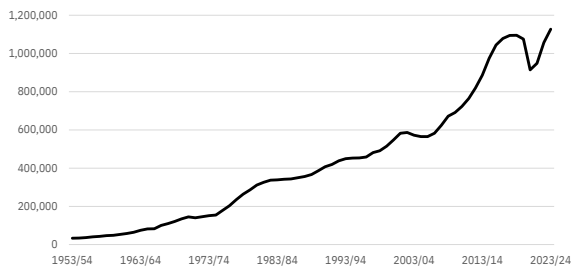


INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS IN THE UNITED STATES

In 2023/24, the total number of international students in the U.S. increased by 7% to a record high of 1,126,690 students.

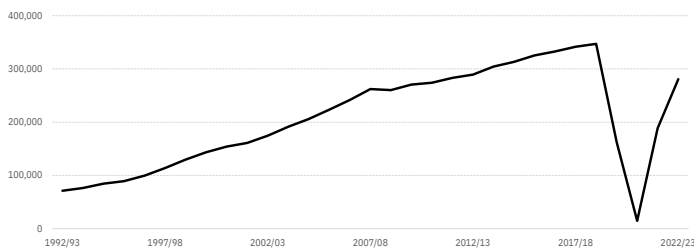

OTHER FORMS OF EDUCATION ABROAD

In addition to the 280,716 U.S. students who received academic credit for study abroad in 2022/23, 333 institutions reported that 25,692 students participated in non-credit experiential activities, such as work, internships, volunteering, and research abroad. Furthermore, 116 U.S. institutions reported that 14,890 students participated in online global learning opportunities, including remote internships, collaborative project-based learning, and video-conference dialogues.
