


INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS IN THE UNITED STATES



OTHER FORMS OF EDUCATION ABROAD

In addition to the 298,180 U.S. students who received academic credit for study abroad in 2023/24, 332 institutions reported that 33,078 students participated in non-credit experiential activities, such as work, internships, volunteering, and research abroad. Furthermore, 105 U.S. institutions reported that 17,426 students participated in online global learning opportunities, including remote internships, collaborative project-based learning, and video-conference dialogues.
